Would you like to be involved in the process that will shape Woodland District 50 schools for the future? A strategic plan is the framework for the process used by the district to support schools and ensure the success of each student. At the core of the strategic plan are five focus areas of study: student learning; student well-being; staff recruitment and development; finance and facilities; and community relations and district pride. These focus areas were set forth by the Board of Education.

We value your opinion and we want to hear what you think. A key element to gathering feedback is the formation of a strategic planning committee.
