Updates	25 min.	<p><u>Community and School Updates:</u></p> <p>Gurnee Park District and Champions discussed Covid-19 reporting to the Lake County Health Dept. Also, discussed was the communicating Covid-19 cases to parents and teachers. Additional items discussed were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Notification to parents and staff if there was close contact • Notification to parents and staff is given if anyone tests positive • Is someone has had close contact with someone who tests positive, they have to remain home for 10 days. • Champions is encouraging handwriting skills as so many students spend a large amount of time on computers. <p><u>Primary School</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Primary is producing videos featuring our mascot, Wiley. The video will review the procedures for dropping off and picking up students for school. • The video also reviews how the children need to walk in the hallways. • Breakfast and lunch procedures are also included in the video. <p><u>Elementary School</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elementary is hosting Kindness Week. Activities range from give someone a compliment to telling someone you are happy to see them. • Kids Heart Challenge has raised over \$6,000 for the American Heart Association. All donations were made by students and their families. • The Health Office is reviewing the 3 W's with students and staff before school resumes. <p><u>Intermediate School</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intermediate School raised over \$9,000 with the Kid Heart Challenge fundraiser program. For this fund raiser, Dr. Lisa West and Chris Dovichi created a fun event which they will be slimed. • Pablo Arboleda and Tim Tyrell are producing on a video to improve attendance. <p><u>Middle School</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Middle School Health Office produced an orientation video for 6th grade students who have never been to the school previously. • Middle School is hosting 10 virtual clubs. • During the February 5th SIP day, teams showed a Camfel movie with the theme of leveling up. This movie is

		<p>usually shown during Red Ribbon Week but we were able to stream it virtually to all students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remote ROAR Recognition enables teachers to reward behavior. Students names are entered into a drawing each week. Roughly 400 students' names have been submitted each week. • P.E. staff created an innovative program that enables students to participate in a different activity every day in the classroom instead of the gym. Activities range from cardio activities to relaxation techniques. • The annual talent show will be hosted virtually this year. • Staff is considering how to celebrate the return of in-person learning.
Update from the Health Office	15 min.	<p>Updates from the Heath Office:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Health Office is developing guidelines on when to send a student home with Covid-19 symptoms. These guidelines will align with guidelines provided by Lake County Health (LCHD) and the Illinois Sept. of Public Health (IDPH). • New Health Office procedures will be developed which enables more communication with parents and teachers. • The Health Office is also developing an educational program for children that will ensure compliance with mask wearing. • The Health Office will be producing a video on how to wear face masks correctly. • The Health Office will also be creating videos on healthy nutrition.
Spring Break Academic Assistance	5 min.	<p>Over spring break, teachers will be able to assist students who were struggling academically. This was a pilot program that began over winter break and will continue over spring break due to the positive feedback.</p>
Parent and Student Handbook	5 min.	<p>Parents suggested that the technology platform for each grade and each school be added whether it is SeeSaw or Schoology.</p> <p>The Transportation department now has an app called MyStop which allows parents to track their child's bus in real time.</p> <p>A reminder was added to the handbook that reminds parents to stop when the arm is down while the children are boarding and exiting the bus.</p>
